

We are hoping to start some after school sports clubs from the week beginning 15th March subject to being able to


maintain social distancing and bubbles. We will be letting parents know shortly what is on offer.



Late Arrivals

It is vitally important that your child arrives to school on time so they can enter the school with their 'bubble'. However, if for any reason you are late please bring you child to the **loading bay gate** (not the front office). Press the **main office** buzzer and give your **child's name and class**.

A member of staff will be asked to collect your child – please be aware if the school day has started this may take some time! so please be patient.



Uniform

We expect all children to return to school in full school uniform.

PE

Just a reminder that all children need to come to school in their PE kit on their allocated days.



We are now offering a wider range of school hot dinners for £2.30 per day. Meals will include a vegetarian option each day, home cooked cakes and a drink. Please remember we are a **'cashless'** school and <u>all payments</u> must be made through SIMS PAY. Please see the new 2 week menu below.



Free School Meals



Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are offered free school meals. This is regardless of your household income.

You do not have to apply for free school meals. However, you can apply for your school to get extra funding from the Government (called Pupil Premium), if you receive one of the benefits listed below:

- Universal Credit with an annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual gross income of no more than £16,190

Children in Year 3 and above

Children in Year 3 and above only receive free school meals if you get one of the benefits listed above. You must apply for these free school meals.
